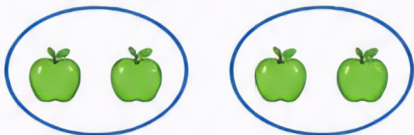
Even and Odd Numbers



EVEN NUMBERS

Even numbers end in 0, 2, 4, 6, or 8.
They can be divided into 2 equal groups with nothing left over.

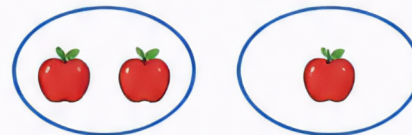
Examples: 2, 4, 6, 8, 10



ODD NUMBERS

Odd numbers end in 1, 3, 5, 7, or 9.
They cannot be divided into 2 equal groups with nothing left over.

Examples: 1, 3, 5, 7, 9
