

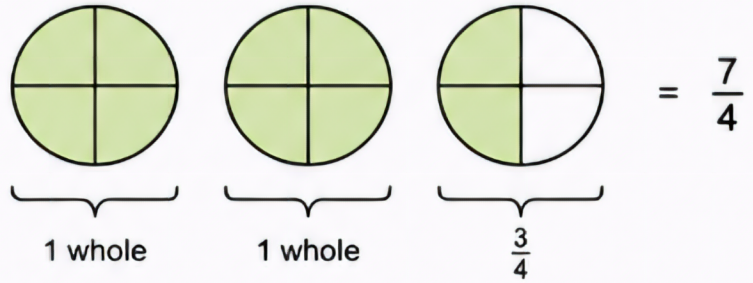

★ Fractions Greater Than One Whole ★

A fraction greater than one whole has a **numerator** (top number) that is **greater** than or **equal** to the **denominator** (bottom number).

Example: $\frac{7}{4}$ is greater than one whole.
It is the same as 1 whole $\frac{3}{4}$.
