Their

shows that something belongs to them.

Use **THEIR** before a noun.

Example:

Their dog is fluffy.



There

tells about a place or location.

Use **THERE** when you mean "in or at that place."

Example:

The park is over **there**.



They're

is a contraction for "they are."

Use **THEY'RE** when you can say "they are."

Example:

They're going to the zoo today.
