Pronoun-Antecedent Agreement

A **pronoun** takes the place of a noun.

The pronoun must agree with its **antecedent**.

- Use **he** or **him** for a boy or a man.
- Use **she** or **her** for a girl or a woman.
- Use **they** or **them** for two or more people or things.



Liam lost his pencil.

He is looking for it.



Maya has a new book.

She is reading it.



Jake and Ella are friends.

They play together.
